


Louis started his *Rapidswim: Learn to Swim* journey by accepting last minute fill in lessons until a permanent spot became available.

3rd place at the 2015 AFL National Inclusion Carnival in Melbourne

The AFL National Inclusion Carnival offers people with an intellectual disability the chance to represent their state on the national stage.

Guided by Glenelg Football Club League coach Matthew Lokan, the SA inclusive football team competed in the carnival from Wednesday August 5th to Sunday August 9th in Melbourne. "It's great to provide anyone with exposure to elite level football by taking some of the coaching methods I use here at Glenelg, into the program" said Lokan.

South Australia tackled teams from Victoria Metro, Victoria Country, Western Australia, Queensland, New South Wales/ACT and Tasmania. They came away with wins against all teams except for Victoria Metro and New South Wales/ACT. SA then went on to defeat Victoria Country in the play-off for third place.

Three SA players Christopher McQueen, Shane Smith and Lindsay Drowley were named in the All-Australian team recognising their efforts during the week, with Shane Smith being named SA's MVP





Partnership with Flinders University on HLPE1531 topic: Sociocultural constructions of movement in physical education

This semester Inclusive Sport SA has partnered with the Education faculty at Flinders University contributing to the HLPE1531 topic, teaching students enrolled in education, sport, health and physical activity courses.

Facilitated by our Inclusion Advisor, Stephanie Greenland (also a part-time Flinders Tutor in the Disability and Community Inclusion Unit), students examine the importance of catering for a diverse range of students in a mainstream physical education lesson, in particular across three sports- AFL, Gymnastics and Dance.

Throughout the semester students will explore modifying and adapting their practice according to a diverse classroom which could include students from ESL backgrounds, multicultural groups and people living with a disability. Students will demonstrate their knowledge of inclusive practice in their major assessment where they will deliver a practical session to their peers showcasing how as teachers they are delivering inclusive practice.

This is an ongoing partnership with the Education faculty and an exciting time for Inclusive Sport SA to share our services and purpose as an organisation to the broader community.
